Introduction

The UK Government in October announced its *Net Zero Strategy: Build Back Greener*¹. In November the Yorkshire & Humber Climate Commission launched its *Climate Action Plan*² where the first element of its framework (p21) is "Acknowledge climate and ecological emergency". North Yorks County Council in their *Beyond Carbon*³ proposal sets out their plan to be carbon neutral by 2030 and Hambleton in their *Climate Change Strategy And Action Plan 2021-2034*⁴ sets out how they plan to be net zero CO₂ emissions by 2034. The recent National Association of Local Councils (NALC) report⁵ found "that 38% of participating councils had already declared a climate emergency and a further 8% were pending declaration".

In this context, it is entirely appropriate that Rudby Parish Council (RPC) develops its own Climate and Environmental Action Plan (CEAP). Any CEAP developed needs to be focussed on local actions but set within the regional, national, and global context.

RPC recognises that the climate crisis is a major issue and RPC needs to take action to reduce CO_2 in line with Government/Regional/District policy.
